<u>Holidays</u>

I would like to remind parents that, the law gives no entitlement to parents to take their children on holiday during term time. As headteacher I no longer have the authority in law to authorise absences for holidays or related activities, unless there are 'exceptional' circumstances. I would not be expected to class any term time holiday as 'exceptional'. This being the case, any requests for term time holidays will be declined and any subsequent absences will be recorded as unauthorised. Please do not take holidays in term time to avoid any misunderstanding. Thank you for your understanding and support in implementing this.

Line up & end of day

Norfolk Step On Parent Training- Supporting you to support your child's behaviour



This training is based on the very successful Norfolk Steps behaviour training that has been offered to teachers and teaching assistants across Norfolk for many years now and was developed for parents only recently and with great success. The course consists of two sessions. The first session will be on <u>Monday 18th September 2023</u>, at

9:00am and the second session on **Monday 25th September (time TBC)**. The sessions are designed to help parents understand their children's behaviour and give strategies to reduce conflict in the home. It will be led by Kim Tully (Norfolk County Council Partner Focus Officer). The training is suitable for all parents with children of all ages.

Water and Snacks

Children should bring a water bottle to school with them which they can keep in a designated area during lessons. Please ensure that this only contains water and is clearly named. Fruit or vegetables can be brought in for morning break; please ensure that this is named and separate from your child's packed lunch as once school starts the children are not able to access their lunch boxes until lunchtime. A box for the storage of playtime fruit will be kept in the classroom.

NUT FREE Also, we are a **<u>nut free school</u>** and make every effort to protect children and staff with peanut allergies and reduce concern from their parents surrounding accidental ingestion or exposure.



Health & Safety



The health and safety of the children of Antingham & Southrepps is of the highest importance. For the safety of the children, please do not park on the yellow zigzag lines outside school. Please be extra cautious when driving in the area around school.

I would like to remind you that you are not allowed to smoke in or on the school premises, which includes the school's playgrounds and field.



Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC)

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated.

I wanted to inform you that we are not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings and therefore they will continue to function as normal. However, we want to take care and to be sure, and are currently working with the DfE to actively check whether RAAC has been used in the construction of any part of our buildings. If RAAC is identified, we will let you know straight away, and we have contingencies in place.

We appreciate the concern this may raise, and we will always prioritise the safety of your children and our staff.

I hope that this offers reassurance.

Reading

We expect all children to read daily for 10-15 minutes, either independently or to an adult. The children will be provided with an appropriate reading book, which will be exchanged regularly in school. If your child is on free readers, they can choose to read a book from home if they wish. Reading books will need to travel to and from school each day with your child in a suitable book bag or folder. Reading will continue to be recorded in a reading diary.



Please let the class teacher know via the reading diary, with a date and

initial, when you hear your child read. Do not feel you always have to write a comment in the comment box, staff will write comments in the diary to help you and your child. It is important to talk to your children about the stories they read as well as just hearing them read the words. This will help you gauge how well your child understands what they read and whether they are enjoying their book.

Zones of Regulation



At Antingham & Southrepps, we recognise the importance of promoting positive mental health and emotional wellbeing to our children and their families. This year we have implemented the Zones of Regulation curriculum in all the classes and we aim to teach our children to identify emotions in themselves and others and provide them with bank of strategies to help regulate their emotions

and improve their wellbeing.

The Zones of Regulation is a range of activities to help your child develop skills in the area of self-regulation. Self-regulation can go by many names, such as self-control, self-management and impulse control. It is defined as the best state of alertness of both the body and emotions for the specific situation. For example, when your child plays in a basketball game, it is beneficial to have a higher state of alertness. However, that same state would not be appropriate in the library.

The Zones of Regulation is a curriculum based around the use of four colours to help children self-identify how they're feeling and categorise it based on colour. The curriculum also helps children better understand their emotions, sensory needs and thinking patterns. The children learn different strategies to cope and manage their emotions based on which colour zone they're in. Additionally, the Zones of Regulation helps children to recognise their own triggers, learn to read facial expressions, develop problem-solving skills, and become more attuned to how their actions affect other people.

There is progression across the curriculum with children in Early Years learning to identify different emotions to children in Upper Key Stage 2 discussing how our behaviour can impact upon the feelings of those around us.
