



What have we been learning?

Henri Matisse Class:-

Over the Spring 2 term, Henri Matisse class has enjoyed learning all about dinosaurs in our Dangerous Dinosaur theme. They have learned vocabulary, such as carnivore, herbivore, fossils, extinct and prehistoric. We appreciated Mr. Pointer (parent) coming into class and showing us his dinosaur fossil collection and allowing the children to sort the fossils into land, sea and human categories, as well as blessing the children with their own little bag of fossils to take home.



We have learned more about the season spring in our Puddles and Rainbow theme, where we have discussed weather graphs, forecasts, and vocabulary around various signs of spring, such as buds, blossoms, daffodils, frost, sunny, cloudy, warm and cold. We have enjoyed learning springtime songs and playing with musical instruments, which will culminate in a Springtime Concert for our parents just before the Easter holidays.

Our storybook, 'Something Else' has allowed the children to become secure in their understanding of different parts of a book, such as the front cover, title, author, illustrator, non-fiction, fiction, table of contents, characters and

theme. We have begun introducing uppercase and lowercase handwriting sessions and a continued focus on writing simple sentences, according to their individual phonetic knowledge.





In maths, they have learned their numbers 0-10, comparing height, length, mass and time. The children thoroughly enjoyed our S.A.W. (Science, Art, Writing) Week with a water, space and forces' theme. Henri Matisse class focussed on experiments, art and writing around the water cycle, the sun, planets and moon and gravity. We had a special visit from Miss Fox and her new baby, Benji, where the children had a chance to see a photo of him as a newborn to him at 9 weeks old. This has helped them to better understand the concept of time.

We look forward to our upcoming class trip/walk to South Repps church and Thrigby Hall Wildlife Garden in the summer terms.

Georgia O'Keeffe Class:--

This term, we have been very busy learning and having fun! We have really enjoyed reading the class text 'Major Glad and Major Dizzy'. This lovely story has given us the opportunity to investigate old-fashioned toys and imagine what it might have been like to live through important events such as World War 2, by writing a diary entry.

We have continued looking at the seasons in science and talked about how the weather and day length changes in different seasons. In Geography, we are finishing learning about London and some of the famous landmarks there.

Everyone worked very hard during our swimming lessons which have now finished. We have also started short Philosophy sessions each week and the children have discussed some interesting and varied ideas!







Takashi Murakami Class – We have had a great half term in Takashi Murakami class and the children have enjoyed leanning about Antartica in their geogrpahy and history lessons. They have learnt about different explorers who have braved the Artic conditions and survived some epic adventures.

Our art learning has made us think about our environment and the world around us. The children have explored environmental artists and have created some amazing sculptures using recycled objects.

In Febraury, we enjoyed our visit to Norwich Cathedral. The whole class represented the school wonderfully well on the train, the walk and when we explored the Cathedral. We even managed to get a snap with Paddington before heading back to school!

Bushcraft has continued to be as excting as ever with the class learning some important life saving skills. With the sun coming to join us, it has made the trips to the woods far less muddy (hopefully meaning less laundry for you!)

I am looking forward to the Summer terms learning where we will be exploring the Second World War in our history lessons, looking at light theory and evolution in science and learning about abstraction in art.
